When a Nigerian presidential candidate failed to win the 2015 election, he was accused of being a puppet of the United States. The accusation was based on a report that the candidate had received a letter from the U.S. State Department, which was said to have offered him a deal: if he lost the election, he would be allowed to travel to the United States and meet with President Obama.
